

# *The Potosí Huastec Region's Natural Beauty*



## Old Mines Falls

*From Ciudad Valles, you take Highway 85 toward Antiguo Morelos, and then Highway 80 9 kilometers toward El Naranjo to the Minas Viejas turn-off. Surrounded by lush vegetation, two 50-meter waterfalls create a pool where visitors can swim and camp. Nearby are other waterfalls and the Laguna de los Patos (Duck Lagoon), where fishing is allowed.*

by waterfalls and ponds.*




## Tamasopo Falls

*These 20-meter-high waterfalls that pour into a five-meter-deep pool are 55 kilometers from Ciudad Valles, San Luis Potosí.*

## Bridge of God Falls

*Four kilometers from the Tamasopo Falls on the way to the El Cafetal train station, after walking 15 minutes, this waterfall is tucked between two hills. With the passage of time, the strong stream of water has created a cavern through which the Tamasopo River flows.*

## Lookout Falls

*A 45-meter drop, the waterfall in El Meco, known by locals as “Lookout Falls,” is one of the biggest attractions in the Potosí Huastec region.*

*It is a fundamental part of the El Salto River, which creates emerald green pools as it flows along.*
